EMBLEM

On a disc per bend sinister nebuly Azure and Sable, a lion rampant Or langued Gules, armed of the second grasping a compass in both paws bendwise sinister, the sinister point piercing a segment of chain ringed bendwise Argent, all within a diminished border Or. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "100TH CIVIL ENGINEER SQ" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "BUILD MAINTAIN PROTECT" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The divided shield indicates the earth and sky. The lion, signifying the pride and courage of the unit, stands on the earth and holds in its paws an engineer's compass in the sky. The compass represents the Squadron's skill and precision with which they do their job. The lion and compass and nebuly dividing line symbolize the Squadron's earth-based link to the Air Force mission. The chain indicates the air base infrastructure maintained by the unit.
