Early in the year the 110th Materiel Squadron was deactivated and replaced with the 110th Consolidated Aircraft Maintenance Squadron commanded by Capt Ralph B. Campbell, Jr., and the 110th Supply Squadron commanded by Maj James L. Noble. 1966

APRIL-1970 Due to lack of training funds, 110th CAM Squadron established its own jet aircraft maintenance specialist school. The first class of 10 men began training on 22 Dec 69 and graduated 6 Mar 1970. They participated in classroom instruction and on-the-job training under the Air Tech instructors MSGT Lininger, TSGT Hanley, and TSGT Pier.

The 110th Tactical Reconnaissance Group, Tactical Air Command, distinguished itself by exceptionally meritorious service from 6 February 1969 to 11 June 1971. During this period, personnel of the Group displayed a high degree of professionalism in the outstanding accomplishment of many command-directed and voluntary missions and exercises while assigned a tactical reconnaissance role. The distinctive accomplishments of the members of the 110th Tactical Reconnaissance Group reflect great credit upon themselves, the Air National Guard, and the United States Air Force. The 110th Tactical Reconnaissance Group Michigan ANG, is awarded the Air Force Outstanding Unit Award for exceptionally meritorious service in support of military operations from 6 Feb 69 to 11 Jun 71.
