EMBLEM

Azure, a sunburst Or, garnished of the first surmounted by a bull's head caboshed Sable, muzzle and eyebrows Blue, eyes and horns Argent, pupils and nostrils Gules, overall in base a suspension bridge of two towers of the last; all within a diminished bordure Yellow. Attached above the disc a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "129th Civil Engineer Squadron" in yellow letters. Attached below the disc a blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed THAT OTHERS MAY LIVE BETTER in yellow letters.

EMBLEM SIGNIFICANCE

Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the

sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The sun also symbolizes the unit's location, the state of California, known as the "Golden State." The bull alludes to "Prime Beef," and the civil engineering responsibilities of the unit. The bridge reflects the rescue operations performed by the unit by offering a crossover to safety for victims. The bridge also symbolizes the squadron's building achievements.
