OPERATIONS

On 1 June 1961, the 133d Aeromedical Evacuation Flight, comprised of flight nurses and enlisted medical specialists, was accorded Federal recognition and attached to the 157th ATG for training and support.

That year, as the unit settled into a new home, the 133rd Aeromedical Evacuation flight was formed. It was comprised of 13 flight nurses and 29 airmen serving as medical aide technicians. Working aboard the C-97 to the 133rd Military Airlift Squadron, New Hampshire medical crews were assigned to assist transporting patients from both Europe and Southeast Asia.

The operational honors were dampened somewhat on October 12 when the 133rd Aeromedical Evacuation Flight was deactivated. The 133rd AME Flight had been organized and Federally recognized on June 10, 1961. The unit's 18 officers and 27 enlisted medical personnel would fill vacancies and augment medical services in the 157th TAG Clinic.
