EMBLEM SIGNIFICANCE

175th CAM Squadron Insignia was designed by TSgt Michael Montalvo. The shield of the Great Seal of Maryland identifies the squadron as a Maryland Air National Guard unit. The four lightning flashes represent the avionics field munitions, and operational maintenance branches of the unit. The lightning flashes converge, demonstrating the squadron's command and staff functions and its unity of purpose. The two aircraft commemorate the units long history of service.

In November 1965, the 135th Materiel Squadron was reorganized and divided into the 135th Consolidated Aircraft Maintenance Squadron and the 135th Supply Squadron. On June 8, 1966, the 135th Communications Flight was federally recognized, replacing the 135th Combat Support

Squadron's communications section. The new unit was attached to the 135th ACG for support, but actually fell under the command of the Air Force Communications Service (AFCS).
