Airmen from the 144th Fighter Wing returned to the Fresno airport from a seven month deployment overseas to Iraq and Afghanistan. Seventeen members of the wing's Civil Engineering RED HORSE Squadron and one member of the Logistics Readiness Squadron departed the base in mid-October 2006 for Fort McCoy, Wis., where they were taught Combat Skills Training by Army personnel prior to departing for the Middle East. Then Airmen deployed to augment the 202nd RED HORSE Squadron from the Florida ANG, which was tasked to perform an Army mission that the Army could not support. The unit's missions included repairing runways, paving roads, and constructing temporary buildings throughout Afghanistan and Iraq. RED HORSE stands for Rapid Engineer Deployable Heavy Operational Repair Squadron Engineers, and the unit's mission is to provide a highly mobile, rapidly deployable civil engineering response force which can perform heavy damage repair for recovery of critical Air Force facilities. 2006
