The 156th Weather Flight (forecasting and observing), NCANG was relieved from attachment to the 156th Fighter Interception Squadron and attached to Headquarters, 145th Aeromedical Transport Group, NCANG, for administrative and logistical support, effective 1 February 1961

The 156 Weather Flight (Mobile/Fixed) and the 206 Weather Flight (SA) have a M-Day assignment to Air Weather Service, an intermediate command under Military Airlift Command. The 156 Weather Flight has continued normal operations during this period without a major change in organizational structure. The maintenance of a high level of operational readiness by the 156 Weather Flight has been noteworthy.

The 156 Weather Flight (Mobile/Fixed) attended annual training at Phelps-Collins ANG Base in Michigan during the period 19 Jul 69 — 2 Aug. 69. This type of training is quite valuable since personnel have an opportunity to provide weather support under field conditions. Reports received indicate that the unit performed in its usual outstanding manner. Unit did not participate in annual training again before the end of this period.
