The Air Base Squadron encompassed many functions, including Supply and Motor Pool.

After the latest reorganization, the authorized strength dropped from 215 to 142, including 11 officers and 131 airmen. Since 1971 the authorized strength continued to decline and current figures are 13 officers and 96 airmen.

The Combat Support Squadron is responsible for the operation of the base in support of assigned (or attached) units. Members perform a wide variety of functions and services. Career fields currently located in the 166 CSS include chaplain, legal, food services, audio visual, personnel, administration, disaster preparedness, small arms, law enforcement, education and training, and social actions.
