EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a peregrine falcon head overall Silver Gray and Smoke, detailed Or, Argent, and Sable, in dexter chief three polestars of the fourth, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "MAINTAINING FREEDOM" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "192D AIRCRAFT MAINT SQ" in Yellow letters.

SIGNIFICANCE: Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to

the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The peregrine falcon embodies the speed and agility with which the members of the Squadron excel as they confront challenges before them. The bird of prey is multi-colored to represent fighter aircraft, as well as the heritage of the local militia. The stars represent the high standards of maintenance of the three primary elements of personnel used to generate aircraft. They are suspended over the right shoulder of the falcon to indicate the readiness of resources and their relevance to “Maintaining Freedom.”
