

258th AERO SQUADRON

Two Hundred Fifty-eighth: Insignia: Reproduction of a lion, apparently carved out of stone. The Two Hundred Fifty-eighth Squadron was a Corps Observation squadron. It was assigned to the Seventh Corps Observation Group, September 10, 1918, and reached the Front at Luxeuil September 19th. This squadron was engaged in the operations in the Vosges Sector. It was finally assigned to the Army of Occupation on April 10, 1919. During its activity on the Western Front it did not suffer any casualties, nor gain any victories which received official confirmation.
