Duties of several officers were changed in April, 1945 as a result of the activation on the 15th of 434th Air Service Group, assigned to Station 136. Several small units operating on this base in conjunction with the 388th Bombardment Group were de-activated and their personnel transferred to the new Service Group, along with scores of officers and men hitherto assigned to the bomb squadrons. Personnel and duties of the 452nd Sub Depot, the 29th Station Complement, the 273rd Medical Dispensary Aviation (RS), the 1751st Ordnance S and N Col, and the 1284th Military Police Co. were largely absorbed by the three squadrons of the 434th Air Service Group; and the remnant of such personnel were transferred to the bomb group Activation of the new service group was to facilitate transfer of the two major units of AAF Station 136 when their duties in this theater are completed, and to consolidate organization for possible operations in the Pacific war zone.
