Constituted in the Organized Reserve on 15 October 1921, assigned to the 6th Attack Wing (Fourth Army), and allotted to the Second Corps Area. Initiated on 21 March 1922 with headquarters at New Dorp, NY. Typically conducted Inactive Training Period meetings at Miller Field, NY. Inactivated 30 January 1930 at New Dorp by relief of personnel. Reorganized and redesignated as Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron, 303rd Attack Group on 1 October 1933. Designated mobilization training station was Mitchel Field, NY.
