EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a demi-globe Silver Gray gridlined Argent, charged with an angry shark upright Oriental Blue, eyed and toothed of the third, fimbriated and detailed Sable and bellied of the second, clinching a lightning bolt in each fin Or, all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "ANYTIME ANYWHERE" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "305TH COMMUNICATIONS SQ" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The shark represents the communications squadron, and like the shark, the unit needs to constantly keep moving in order to survive. The technology requires constant movement and changes in direction in order to stay relevant. The lightning bolts are the traditional symbol for communication, as well as representing the instantaneous nature of modern communications. The Squadron provides the reigns of command to the 305th Mobility Wing, all the mission partners and tenant units. The globe represents the global mobility mission of the parent wing. Through modern communications instruments, individuals can be instantly connected to anyone on the planet. The motto represents the "Can Do" attitude of the unit to do whatever is necessary to accomplish the mission, whether at home station or a deployed location.
