**OPERATIONS**

The 314 Operational Maintenance Squadron called the building their "wash rack." Working three shifts per day, the 314 OMS can clean three aircraft in 24 hours. An underground 7,000 gallon water tank and six service ports double as emergency fire control. Ultraviolet sensors trigger the outlets to dump more than a thousand gallons of foam and water onto the aircraft in one minute, dousing any flame that might flare up during cleaning operations.
