EMBLEM



3708th Basic Military Training Squadron

On a blue octagon edged gold, a circle of gold chain links detailed brown surmounted at the top by a gold inverted triangle and on the bottom by a brown triangle between in the vertical center two gold chain links winged fesswise white detailed gray. The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission. Against the background of blue, depicting the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations, the circle of gold chain indicates the unit's goal of strength through unity with two links in the center referring to the last digit of their numerical designation. The swift and efficient completion of the squadron's mission is signified by the winged eight linking the brown triangle (symbolizing the raw recruit) and the gold triangle (representing the trained airman) which

symbolizes the unit's motto. The emblem bears the Air Force colors, gold and ultramarine blue.
