#### EMBLEM



On a disc divided vertically blue to dexter, light blue to sinister, a white flight symbol above six stars of the like chevronwise in base and overall in chief an atomic symbol, the eight nuclei alternating white and blue surrounded by three yellow orbit rings each bearing a flight symbol of the like; all within a narrow blue border. Attached above the disc a yellow scroll edged with a narrow blue border. Attached below the disc a yellow scroll edged with a narrow blue border and inscribed IN PURSUIT OF EXCELLENCE in blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE**: Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The atom with its electron trails and aircraft symbols represent the science of avionic electronics. The aerodynamic design signifies the many types of aircraft supported by the unit. The globe, indicating worldwide support, is divided to reflect around the clock maintenance. (Approved, 6 May 1988)
