EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a base dancetty Vert, overall a cross-couped Gules, fimbriated Argent, rayed of five throughout of the like, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "366TH AEROMEDICAL-DENTAL SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force

colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The dancetty base suggests mountains and alludes to the unit's home base and its parent wing. The cross, a traditional medical symbol, represents the Squadron's function of maintaining wing personnel combat capable through aggressive preventative medicine programs. The five rays reflect the Squadron's areas of medical responsibilities.
