EMBLEM

381 Missile Maintenance Squadron emblem: On a light blue disc within a red border, the two separated by a thin white inner edge, centered on a pair of AF blue wings detailed white and AF

yellow, within two red lightning flashes, a white missile in perspective, detailed AF blue, with a red top emitting white, yellow and red flames. Below the disc a blank yellow scroll edged AF blue. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The missile denotes the ICBM-Titan II which is maintained by the squadron. The red lightning flashes both indicate the aerospace retaliation force. The yellow flame represents strength and power. The blue wings allude to flight and the light blue background represents the sky. (Approved, 19 Aug 1963)
