OPERATIONS

Constituted in the Organized Reserve 15 October 1921 as the 21st Airdrome Company, assigned to the Sixth Army, and allotted to the Second Corps Area. Initiated 7 March 1922 at Albany, NY. Redesignated on the 411th Airdrome Company 25 January 1923. Inactivated about July 1927 at Albany by relief of personnel. Redesignated 411th Airdrome Squadron 1 October 1933. Concurrently relieved from the First Army and assigned to the General Headquarters Reserve. Consolidated on 28 November 1936 with the 411th Aero Squadron (Construction) (a WWI unit organized in November 1917 at Vancouver Barracks, WA; redesignated as the 5th Spruce Squadron July 1918; demobilized in January 1919 at Vancouver Barracks, WA; reconstituted on 28 November 1936). Designated mobilization training station was Mitchel Field, NY. Status: Disbanded 31 May 42.
