412 Maintenance Squadron emblem

412 Maintenance Squadron emblem: On a disc Azure, in front of an aerial bomb palewise point to

base Argent detailed Sable, highlighted of the second (White), a wrench bendwise of the like surmounted by a lightning bolt in saltire Or, within an orle of nine pole stars White, all within a diminished border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "412 MXS" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "VIS UNIVERSUS" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The bomb symbolizes armament systems and the Squadron's part in supporting the flight test mission to precisely put ordnance on target. The wrench emphasizes the tools necessary for the unit to perform its mission. The lightning bolt represents the avionics and electronic maintenance the unit performs. The stars allude to the constant guiding light of the Squadron's flight focus on mission accomplishment. (Approved, 8 May 1997; reinstated, 26 Jun 2003)
