EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, two chevrons opposed fesswise in chief emitting entwined contrails. A Sable chevron to dexter with a Gules contrail issuing from dexter base, and an Argent chevron to sinister emitting a contrail of the second issuing from sinister base all fimbriated Or. In chief a mullet of the fourth charged with a torteau and emitting three lightning flashes, one to dexter one to sinister and one pale wise of the fifth, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "432 ACMS" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The star and lightning bolts represent critical communications essential to operate aircraft while illuminating the wartime theater and expressing the evolution of airpower by the entwined deltas below.
