### **EMBLEM**

On a disc Or, a cross Gules, edged Sable, surmounted by an eagle Volant Azure, garnished Celeste, grasping a ring of the fourth, dangling a globe of the fifth, its axis tilted to sinister, gridlined of the first, all within a narrow border Black. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "DELIVERING A HEALTHY WORKFORCE" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "436TH MEDICAL OPERATIONS SQ" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The red cross symbolizes international humanitarianism. The eagle carrying the globe represents the strength of the unit and the world-class health care it provides. (Approved, 16 Sep 2011)
