EMBLEM



On a medium blue disc edged with a narrow black border, within a circular pattern of Air Force yellow stars, four on the viewer's left, six at the top of the disc and five on the viewer's right, a white cloud above a gray gauntlet detailed black highlighted white rising diagonally from the lower half of the disc on the viewer's right and grasping yellow and red flight symbol. Below the gauntlet a green olive branch detailed Air Force yellow. Below the disc a yellow scroll edged black and inscribed EQUITIS ARMA in blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The blue field, white cloud and Air Force yellow stars are symbolic of sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. The armored hand and the flight symbol represents the unit's mission. The olive branch denotes peace. EQUITIS ARMA - Arms for the knight (Approved, 11 Feb 1964)
