OPERATIONS

Constituted in the Organized Reserve on 31 March 1924, assigned to the 347th Bombardment Group (GHQR), and allotted to the Third Corps Area. Initiated in March 1925 at Coplay, PA. Inactivated on 23 July 1929 at Coplay by relief of personnel. Consolidated on 2 December 1936 with the 483rd Aero Squadron (a WWI unit organized in August 1917 at Kelly Field, TX, as the 71st Aero Squadron; redesignated as the 483rd Aero Squadron [Construction] in February 1918; demobilized in February 1919 at Camp Lee, VA; reconstituted on 2 December 1936). Conducted summer training at Phillips Field, MD, with the 49th Bombardment Squadron. Status: Disbanded on 31 May 1942.
