# EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, emitting from base a demi-globe of the field, land masses Vert surmounted by an American bald eagle in flight Proper, grasping in its talons three arrows fanned fesswise Proper and a scroll bendwise Argent; all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "PROELIATOR EXCELLENTIA PACTUM" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "633D CONTRACTING SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The globe represents the unit's global mission—always ready to deploy anywhere when needed. The eagle symbolizes the warrior mentality required of all personnel and the ability to move swiftly between all parts of the globe at a moment's notice. The arrows refer to the traditional warrior fighting instrument. The scroll is for the traditional source document for contracts—paper.
