EMBLEM

635 Air Mobility Support Squadron emblem: A disc divided into a blue sky and a medium blue base with a brown mountain on the horizon below three white clouds. On the blue portion, three yellow discs connected by two converging yellow rays. The first disc bearing a white lightning flash, second disc a white forklift, third disc a white wrench, all outlined black and all within a narrow yellow border. Attached above the disc a white scroll edged yellow and inscribed 635 AMSS, the unit's name. Attached below the disc a white scroll edged yellow and inscribed "Kokua Imua Lanakila" in blue letters. The emblem is symbolic of the unit and the Air Force colors: ultramarine blue and golden yellow. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air force operations, and yellow to the sun and the excellence required of personnel in their assigned tasks. The three symbols represent the mission of the unit. The circled lightning bolt represents the Air Mobility Control Center's command and control responsibility. The second circle represents support provided by the Logistics Flight, as indicated by a wrench. The third circle represents the Transportation Flight, as symbolized by a forklift. The mountain in the background is a landmark in the middle of the Pacific Ocean. (Approved, 15 May 1972)
