EMBLEM



913 Consolidated Aircraft Maintenance Squadron emblem: On a blue disc, a green globe grid lined white issuing from lower right and a yellow sun rayant issuing from upper left; overall a bald eagle proper, wings elevated resting on a white dexter hand issuing at wrist from the globe; all within a narrow yellow border. Attached above the disc a white scroll edged with a narrow yellow border and inscribed WE KEEP THEM FLYING in blue letters and attached below the disc a white scroll edged with a narrow yellow border. Significance Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and

the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The globe symbolizes the unit's worldwide capability. The hand launching the eagle signifies the lift that maintenance technicians give to the aircraft in their undying efforts to keep them flying. (Approved, 23 Sep 1987)

913 Maintenance Squadron emblem: On a disc Azure, issuing from base a sphere Vert, axis to sinister gridlined Argent, issuing from sinister chief a rayant sun Or, detailed Brün, overall a bald eagle rising Proper, wings displayed and perched on the sphere; all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "WE KEEP THEM FLYING" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "913TH MAINTENANCE SQUADRON" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The globe symbolizes the unit's worldwide capability. The bald eagle launching from the globe signifies the undying efforts maintenance personnel provide to the aircraft to keep them flying.
