EMBLEM



On a disc Sable, a gear wheel throughout Argent bearing a clock face with 12- hour marks of the first, surmounted at fess point by a hurt fimbriated Or bearing a mullet of the second charged by a torteau, overall a wrench and dagger conjoined from the handles at fess point Sable wrench

head pointing to 9 o'clock and blade pointing to the 19th minute; all within a narrow Black border. Attached above the disc, a Light Blue scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "ANY TIME ANY PLACE" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a Light Blue scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "919 SOMXS" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE.** Ultramarine Blue and Air Force Yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. Black denotes the night sky, which is symbolic of night operations, a hallmark of Special Operations units. The gear wheel shows the Squadron's ties and functionality within aircraft maintenance. It further symbolizes the unit's progress forward and their part in the larger Air Force machine, where they must come together in unity and conjunction with others to make things work. The clock pattern, with a wrench and dagger as hands, is set to 9:19, suggesting that the Squadron is ready to bring their equipment to fight at "Any Time." The Hap Arnold star represents the Air Force and Special Operations heritage. The star is a symbol of the global force and shows that the unit is ready to join fellow Airmen in arms "Any Place." 4 Apr 2022
