EMBLEM



On a disc Celeste, a sphere of the first, gridlined and edged Azure, bearing a lightning bolt Or and key Argent (Silver Gray) in saltire, within two borders Sable and of the fourth, a stylized Cerberus of the fifth couchant, facing forward, front legs coming from behind the sphere to front, eyed of the third, detailed of the fourth; all within a narrow border Blue. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Gray border and inscribed "ABEAMUS" in Gray letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Gray border and inscribed "932D LOGISTICS READINESS FLT" in Gray letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. Cerberus, the three-headed dog, suggests the three elements of the unit: logistics planning, supply and transportation. The globe is symbolic of the extensive range of the Scott AFB logistics support mission and the capability to sustain the unit's forces. The wheel encircling the globe denotes the unit's transportation element. The key symbolizes the security, safekeeping and control of material management in the old Quartermaster Corps tradition. The lightning bolt alludes to the integrating role of contingency operations and the capability to combine essential logistics elements into a coherent plan supporting the warfighter.
