#### **EMBLEM**



On a disc per fess abase Gules and Celeste rayed of six to chief Or, issuant from base throughout a trident barbed of the first, fimbriated Sable, the center tine extended and overlayed by a globe, between and behind the outer tines, Azure grid lined and edged Argent, all within a narrow border Blue. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "944TH LOGISTICS READINESS SQ" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The light blue at bottom symbolizes liberty the basis of America's way of life. The upper scarlet and Air Force yellow portion recalls the thirteen original states. The trident is taken from the parent wings heritage. The globe at the center of the design represents the worldwide support provided by the unit. (Approved, 30 Dec 2003)
