EMBLEM



2 Transportation Squadron emblem

2 Logistics Readiness Squadron emblem: On a disc Azure, in chief a pelican in its piety wings elevated erased Or, and in sinister a pegasus wings elevated erased respectant Argent, issuant from base a demi-globe Vert, gridlined of the field; all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "RAPID RESPONSIVE RELIABLE" in Yellow letters. Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "2D LOGISTICS READINESS SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. On a sphere, a pelican and a pegasus soar above a globe representing the unit's commitment to the worldwide aerospace mission. The pelican's head symbolizes the supply career field and re-supplying the Second Bomb Wing. The pegasus symbolizes transportation by land, sea and air. The globe is symbolic of the extensive range of the logistics support mission and represents the readiness and ability of personnel to deploy and sustain forces worldwide. (Approved, 18 Mar 2003)
