2nd Staff Squadron was constituted in the Regular Army on 1 Sep 1936 and assigned to the General Headquarters Air Force, and allotted to the Third Corps Area. Concurrently organized at Bolling Field, DC. The squadron was responsible for flying and maintaining various types of aircraft for the flight-rated officers of Headquarters, General Headquarters Air Force in Washington DC, to maintain their flying ability. It also provided planes and crews for the Secretary of War and General Staff officers of the War Department for transportation in performance of their duties.
