### EMBLEM

On a disc Azure, a long sword bendwise point to base Proper hilted, hafted and pommeled Or detailed Sable, surmounted by a terrestrial globe Argent displaying landmasses and gridlines of the first all counterchanged per bend sinister and fimbriated of the second within an orbital ring of the like terminating in sinister chief with a space satellite Silver Gray, all within a diminished bordure per bordure Air Force Yellow and Ultramarine Blue.

Attached below the disc a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "10TH DENTAL SQUADRON" in Blue letters.

### EMBLEM SIGNIFICANCE

Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The sword reflects the unit's support of the U.S. Air Force Academy. The globe signifies the worldwide mission and the two colors, blue and white, symbolize the 24-hour, seven day a week commitment. The satellite is a symbol for the Air Force mission and the unit's support of that mission.
