Between 1971 and 1973, AFCS eliminated its regions, or intermediate headquarters

organizations, in compliance with continuing Air Force budget austerity. When Headquarters AFCS inactivated the 9th and 12th Tactical Communications Regions, all their groups and squadrons reported directly to the Tactical Communications Area headquarters, making that organization similar to the Northern and Southern Communications Areas. Eventually, this consolidation saved hundreds of manpower spaces since only a few expanded support staff spaces were required to provide the necessary communications-electronics support to a particular command headquarters or base organization which an AFCS unit served.
