EMBLEM



Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The triangle indicates the direct support of the squadron to the three groups under the Wing. The yellow pile suggests a ray of light and reflects a sense of well-being through knowledge. The eagle, a national symbol of defense, represents the dedication of unit personnel to the Air Force global reach mission. Approved, 3 Feb 1998
