EMBLEM



The tower represents the unit responsibility to install, remove, and maintain antenna towers in the European theater. The antenna and lightning bolt represent the unit responsibility to install, remove, and maintain radio transmission capabilities in support of Allied Forces. The atom with

electronics represents the unit responsibility to install, remove, and maintain a variety of electronics systems such as NAVAIDS, meteorological, aircraft control and warning, and secure communications. The hands on the tower represent the requirement for unit personnel to climb high structures. Meshing gears represents the teamwork required between and among unit wire and electronics teams of specialists to accomplish mission taskings.
