EMBLEM

On a disc Or, a stylized Bengal tiger Proper riding a stylized “Mustang” horse Proper at full gallop to sinister; all within a narrow border Azure. Attached below the disc, a Yellow scroll edged with a narrow Blue border and inscribed "26TH WEAPONS SQUADRON" in Blue letters. (Approved, 20 Mar 1945; Updated rendition approved, 31 Mar 1995; Newest rendition approved, 28 Jan 2009)

EMBLEM SIGNIFICANCE

Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The “Mustang” alludes to the P-51 Mustang flown by the unit as the 26th

Pursuit Squadron. The tiger represents the power of the Air Force. The tiger on the mustang's back is symbolic of the Air Force's dependence upon each squadron carrying out its mission in order for the Air Force to accomplish its mission. The swift advance of both animals indicates the readiness of the Squadron to perform its assigned mission.

Weapons School Activates Special UAV Unit: The USAF Weapons School at Nellis AFB, Nev., has activated the 26th Flying Training Squadron as the 26th Weapons Squadron, one dedicated to producing elite Predator and Reaper unmanned aerial vehicle pilots and sensor operators. The unit's first class is to commence in January. Col. Scott Kindsvater, commandant of the Weapons School, called the stand-up of the new UAV squadron "a momentous occasion for a community of aviators that have been without this level of tactical integration and training in their history." He noted, too, that it's the first activation of a new unit for the school since creation of the F-117 and B-2 divisions in 2002. The new unit inherits the 26th patch, which had its origins with the 26th Pursuit (changed to Fighter in May 1942) Squadron activated in November 1940. Leading the new 26th WPS is Lt. Col. Daniel Turner.

With pilot production down dramatically, the command reassessed the need for four flying training squadrons at each UPT base and concluded two would do. Accordingly, on 1 October 1992, ATC inactivated the following units: the 43d and 49th Flying Training Squadrons at Columbus AFB, Mississippi; the 84th and 86th Flying Training Squadrons at Laughlin AFB, Texas; the 7th and 26th at Vance AFB, Oklahoma; and the 33d at Reese AFB, Texas. That left one T-37 squadron and one T-38 squadron at each UPT wing. As each wing implemented specialized undergraduate pilot training, ATC intended to reactivate one of the squadrons to serve as the T-1A squadron. 1992

In subsequent years after operations in the CBI theater, the 26th Fighter Squadron was reactivated at Naha, Okinawa and the 2nd logo above (depicting the "Lancers") was the new squadron insignia. In the mid-fifties, the 26th was transferred to Clark Field and an old previous design by Walt Disney depicting a Tiger atop a Mustang was resurrected and was deemed the new squadron logo in keeping with its heritage in the CBI. -- 26th Fighter Squadron (CBI)

The 57th FIS ("The Black Knights of Aroostook") was activated at Presque Isle AFB on March 27, 1953, and also assigned to the 4711 th ADW. The 4711 th was now being commanded by Colonel James Beckwith. The newly activated 57th FIS was commanded by Major Claude Hanley, who

had previously been the commanding officer of the 26th FIS on Okinawa. (The 26th FIS, as the aforementioned 16th FIS that Adams had commanded, was a part of the 51st FIW. The 16th and 25th FIS's went to Korea in September 1950, while the 26th FIS remained on Okinawa to serve as that Wing's Operational Training Unit. Cptain Russell Brown, who scored the first air-to-air jet kill with a F-80 over a MiG 15 in November 1950, and now was serving as operations officer of the 4711th ADW's 37th FIS, had also been a member of the 26th FIS). Cptain Robert Staton was transferred from the 27th FIS to the new 57th FIS to serve as their operations officer.

In April 1955 Lt. Colonel Walter Hardee was selected as their new squadron commander. Hardee had been the commander of the 26th FIS on Okinawa when the Korean Conflict started.

Competition is used to enhance proficiency, and the USAF has always used gunnery meets to this end. In October 1952 the 35th Fighter Interceptor Wing played host to the Far East Air Force gunnery meet that brought together squadrons from as far away as the 13th Air Force's 44th FIS from Clark Field, PI, along with the 20th Air Force's 4th and 26th FIS's from Okinawa. The F-94s did not score well, although one hapless pilot did get a tow bar on the Mito Gunnery Range. Much to everyone's dismay, the meet was won by four 2nd Lieutenants from the 40th FIS who were flying antiquated F-51s. The follow-up Worldwide Gunnery Meet was held the following spring at Yuma, Arizona. It was won by a F-51 pilot.

A series of errors led to the crash of an MQ-9 Reaper remotely piloted aircraft last December during a combat training mission at the Nevada Test and Training Range, announced Air Combat Command on Tuesday. Preflight, contract technicians improperly configured throttle-related settings in the ground control station, states ACC's release, which cites the findings of the command's abbreviated accident investigation board report released on April 9. The pilot conducting the preflight inspection—who was not the pilot who flew the Reaper during the mission—did not execute all parts of the checklist and thus did not notice this, according to the release. During the mission, as the pilot tried to change the Reaper's altitude by adjusting the throttle, "the misconfigured throttle commanded the aircraft engine to produce reverse thrust" that led to a stall that ultimately resulted in the crash, states the release. The MQ-9 and crew were assigned to the 26th Weapons Squadron at Nellis AFB, Nev. In addition to the Reaper, the Air Force lost one inert bomb, one Hellfire training missile, a mission kit, and one missile rail in the crash. The loss of the MQ-9 and the other items is valued at some \$9.6 million. 2013

Weapons School Reaper Successfully Strikes Maritime Target An MQ-9 Reaper assigned to the

26th Weapons Squadron at Nellis AFB, Nev., successfully struck a target in the Gulf of Mexico on March 17, marking the first time the Reaper was successfully used to interdict sea-going targets in a joint exercise, Weapons School officials announced last week. "For our [RPA] community it's a big step forward, it's a mission set we had looked at for a long time, and training opportunities over water are not very prevalent [at Nellis]," said Capt. Timothy Ford, the 26th WPS flight commander. During the joint exercise, Reaper crews also integrated with other aircraft including A-10s, F-16s, and the F-35A. In addition to hitting the maritime target, Reaper crews coordinated attacks with the F-35 for the first time, and built collaboration and deconfliction skills, said Capt. Ryan Cross, a training officer with the 26th WPS. Airmen with the 26th WPS are collaborating to improve tactics in other mission sets at the Weapons School as well, to include using the MQ-9 in strike and close air support scenarios. 2015
