EMBLEM

The eagle represents the Air Force's significant mission in the defense of the doctrine and ideals of the United States. The Centurion holding the reins represents the officer (Roman soldier) and NCO (reins) responsibilities in guiding and fulfilling the Air Force mission. Stars represent the four operational functions of the Air Force Communications Command: air traffic control; navigational aids; telecommunications; and communications-electronics. The stars also depict the role these four functions play in the support of the Air Force mission via the eagle preparing to use the stars to land on. The sword represents the overall strength and versatility of communications. The six thunderbolts emitted from the sword depict the rapid communications involved in our various support roles. The quote "Unity Through Communications" depicts the role communications has in molding together the various support and operational function of the United States Air Force.
