The 31 Civil Engineer Squadron is responsible for facility, airfield, and utility system construction, operations, and maintenance; fire, explosive ordnance, and disaster response forces; unaccompanied and family housing facilities and programs; and environmental security for Aviano Air Base. The squadron also supports three primary and thirteen secondary geographically separated units as well as five contingency and seven communication sites in southern Europe and the Mediterranean.

EMBLEM



Per bend nebuly OR and Azure, on a hurt a bull's face of the first horned Argent and snorting steam to base from its nostrils of the like; all within a diminished bordure of the second. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Blue and yellow are the Air force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force

personnel. The nebuly bend represents the interlocking importance of the civil engineering functions with the Air Force's mission of defending the country. The red disk denotes the valor and courage of the unit's personnel, both past and present, to give the ultimate sacrifice, if necessary. The ball represents the determined and vigorous strength required to accomplish the mission. (Approved, 16 Nov 1994)
