2067 Communications Squadron emblem: On a blue disc edged with a narrow yellow border, in the vertical center a light blue antenna emitting six red and white lightning flashes, three to dexter and three to sinister ; attached at the base of the antenna on each side a yellow wing elevated and detailed brown. **SIGNIFICANCE:** The wings indicate Tactical Air Command's wings; and the antenna and radio waves indicate the unit's function of providing communications in support of Tactical Air Command's mission.
