EMBLEM

A disc with a narrow gold border above a white scroll edged with gold, the disc blazoned as follows: Azure, between two pairs of wings conjoined in leure those in chief inverted argent surmounted by a cross throughout or, a plate bearing a cross throughout sanguine surmounted by the rod of Aesculapius staff gold serpent of the first. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and golden yellow are the Air Force colors. The white disc with the dark red cross surmounted by the rod of Aesculapius stands for the 42d Medical Service Squadron. The horizontal and vertical arms of the cross extending over the blue area represent a line of latitude and of longitude; they allude to the globe and to the receiving of casualties by the Casualty Staging Unit from all over the world. The wings stand for aircraft and the airmen served by the Squadron. In addition, the four arms of the cross and the two pairs of wings allude to the Squadron's numerical designation.
