EMBLEM

On a disc Silver Gray, within an inner border Sable, in chief eight mullets bend sinisterwise in two rows, four and four Or, above in base the historic National Aircraft Insignia Azure and Argent, emitting from its sinister side two contrails curving and ascending to dexter terminating in two stylized deltas of the second, all within a narrow border Silver Gray. Attached below the disc, a Black scroll edged with a narrow Silver Gray border and inscribed "44 AMXS" in Silver Gray letters. Attached above the disc, a Black scroll edged with a narrow Silver Gray border and inscribed "AGGRESSOR BEWARE" in Silver Gray letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The field and eight stars represent the heavens and the security provided by the airpower that the Squadron supports. The historic 1943-1947 National Aircraft Insignia is an overt reminder of this unit's link to its past and its name sake, the 44 Bombardment Group's, courageous actions during that war. During WWII, these airman coined a war cry: "Aggressor Beware." The stylized deltas with contrails signify the Squadron's link to aviation and their pride in producing airpower.
