#### **EMBLEM**

On a disk Azure, a hurt entoured by a three-pronged lightning bolt radiating from a single point on the upper hemisphere and arching reversed to sinister edge Gules, overall in pale issuant from

base a missile Argent exhausting a flame cone of the second and a propulsion trail Or, in dexter chief a pole star of the like, all within a bordure per bordure Sable and Yellow. Attached above the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "45TH COMMUNICATIONS SQ" in Black letters. Attached below the disc, a White scroll edged with a narrow Black border and inscribed "SECUNDUS NEMINI" in Black letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The globe symbolizes the unit's world-wide mission. The lightning flashes refer to the "Reins of Command." The missile signifies the space-based mission. The polestar describes the clarity of the communications provided by the unit's satellites.
