MISSION

The 45th Logistics Readiness Flight provides supply, fuel, transportation and deployment support to the 45th Space Wing as well as tenant organizations for Patrick Air Force Base, Cape Canaveral Air Station and down range sites (Antigua and Ascension Island). The main mission is to provide support for combat. Capabilities through launch, range and expeditionary operations maintaining the highest possible state of logistic readiness.

Base Supply team are dedicated professionals who provide supply support including, fuels, munitions, mobility, hazmat, bench stock, supply points, individual equipment, and equipment management to the 45 Space Wing, tenants, and contractors at Patrick AFB, Cape Canaveral Air Station and down range sites (Antigua and Ascension Island).

Customer Operations Section provides Base Supply customer service, demand processing, research and MICAP support to personnel assigned to the 45th Space Wing, its tenants, and other customers.

Records Management Section provides for accurate management of supply records in Base Supply.

Storage & Issue Section manages warehouse storage, MRSP, repair cycle support, CE-MAA, and CE Self-Help Store the 45th Space Wing, its tenants, and other customers.

Special Storage Section manages munitions, weapons, Mobility, and HAZMART Pharmacy the 45th Space Wing, its tenants, and other customers.

Delivery & Receiving Section provides timely receipt, delivery, and pick up of parts going to the

45th Space Wing, its tenants, and other customers.

Supply Fuels Operation Section provides aviation, cryogenic, and ground fuel support to organizations assigned to the 45th Space Wing, its tenant units, and other transiting customers.

Transportation Management are professionals providing diverse transportation services to 45th Space Wing, tenants, and contractors at Patrick AFB, Cape Canaveral Air Force Station and downrange sites (Antigua and Ascension Island). The Traffic Management Office, Air Passenger/Cargo Terminal, and Freight Services Sections plan, schedule and arrange the airlift, sealift, and surface transportation for all authorized Department of Defense passengers, cargo and their personal property.

The Traffic Management Office arranges for the timely movement and storage of personal property for authorized Department of Defense personnel. To arrange air, bus and rail travel for Department of Defense personnel traveling on Permanent Change of Station (PCS) or Temporary Duty (TDY) orders.

Freight Services arranges for the worldwide movement of supplies and equipment using both commercial and military modes of transportation. Shipping services are provided to the 45th SW units, tenants, contractors and other authorized Department of Defense shippers.

The Air Terminal receives, processes, loads/unloads authorized passengers and cargo on arriving, departing, and transiting aircraft.

EMBLEM

On a disc Sable, a globe Azure, dashed grid lines Argent, charged in sinister with a polestar of the like emitting a contrail encircling the globe ascending to sinister chief terminating in a delta point to dexter chief Or, all within a narrow border Yellow. Attached above the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "PERITUS ET PROMPTUS" in Yellow letters Attached below the disc, a Blue scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "45TH LOGISTICS READINESS SQ" in Yellow letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The gold contrail represents the fiery exhaust a rocket displays as it launches into space. The white polestars in the sky and space symbolize the glowing lights of the solar system as well as the bright desire of the organization to achieve its future goals. The movement tracked globe signifies the unit's capabilities for movement and progression of the mission. The rocket launching into orbit represents the unique support the unit offers to the mission of its parent wing. Four individual polestars also symbolize Deployment and Distribution, Materiel Management, Vehicle Management and Fuels Management.
