### **OPERATIONS**

Active in the Reserve from 1947-1949 and 1949-1951, the 46 participated in routine training activities. Activated in the Reserve again in May 1955, the squadron evidently trained in and flew the F-84, placing emphasis on gunnery and flying training. Its primary mission became one of air defense of Memphis and the mid-South. In June 1957, the squadron underwent transition training to fly the F-86. USAF changeover to troop carrier functions led to the 46's inactivation in Nov 1957. From 1968, the squadron provided aircraft and personnel to participate in Arc Light combat mission in Southeast Asia, and over the years participated in exercises such as Bar None, Top Rung, Snowtime, Big Blast, High Noon, and Red Flag. In Sep 1987 the squadron acquired the B-1B which it flew until inactivation in 1994.

46 Bombardment Squadron supplied crews and support to tactical war in Southeast Asia 1969

46 Bombardment Squadron flew eighty-seven sorties in support of Operation Hardhead. 1964

Members of 46 Bombardment Squadron participated in mock attack against carrier group at Miramar Naval Air Station CA. 1989

Crews from 46 BS deployed to Pease AFB MA for COMLANT fleet exercise. 319 BW crews participated in Red Flag, Copper Flag and two joint exercises with navy. 1989

Acquired B-52Hs previously used by the 30 BS/4133 SW on 1/2/63 and operated this model until 1982 when re-equipped with the B-52G. Disposed of B-52G in 1986 and subsequently gained the B-1B in 1987.
