Over and through a yellow disc, a caricatured black crow, wings and tail edged light green, beak, goggles, and feet orange, red scarf about the neck, white parachute straps and spats, brown aviator's helmet, smoking a cigarette gray and black, and leaning with right wing on gray aerial bomb, point to base, all casting gray-green shadow across base of disc. (Approved, 22 Jul 1943)

He was thinking fondly of the Lockheed Hudson bombers which were to take part in this enforced diet, and of the part they had so recently played in maneuvers.
