MISSION

The 49 Maintenance Group consists of a team of over 2,100 Airmen, civilians, and contractors from 23 specialties to produce disciplined maintenance and sortie-generation capabilities on F-16 Falcons, MQ-9 Reapers, and associated Ground Control Stations (GCS) valued at \$2.5B. The 49 MXG supports the world's largest Fighter Basic Course, tasked with producing over 113 combatready F-16 pilots per year.

The group also supports MQ-9 Pilot and Sensor Operator training in the Air Force's largest Formal Training Unit, tasked with producing over 700 combat-ready aircrew per year. The MXG Maintenance Operations Flight manages the scheduling of over 22K flying hours and supports the group and wing with 165 personnel across 9 sections and 13 AFSCs, to include CSS, AFETS, Plans & Scheduling, Analysis, Weapons Standardization, Quality Assurance, Maintenance Training, Engine Management, and the Maintenance Operations Center. Additionally, the group delivers back shop maintenance to support T-38 Talons and QF-16 Aerial Targets while providing a continuous presence of qualified maintainers for Combatant Commanders conducting combat operations from three forward operating locations.
