EMBLEM

On a disc divided diagonally from the viewer's upper right to lower left, the upper half black, the lower half light blue, within a narrow, black border, a white thunderbolt crossed by a red vapor trail forming an "X," the vapor trail originating from a white opened book on the blue portion and terminating behind a white missile on the black portion. Originating in the base of the disc a flesh color arm uplifted, the hand grasping a yellow torch in the vertical center enflamed red. Above the flame in the top of the disc on the vertical center a yellow star, all of the design elements outlined black. Above the disc a blank scroll edged black. Motto: Below the disc a yellow scroll edged black and inscribed KNOWLEDGE IS STRENGTH in black letters. Significance: The light blue and black background alludes to the blue sky and the darkness of space. The yellow star symbolizes spacial bodies, the eventual designation of the Aero-Space Team, of which the squadron is a component part. The Aero-Space vehicle rising into space, trailed by an exhaust

path of red from a text book, is symbolic of the goal of the squadron of continual advancement of knowledge through technical instruction. The hand and the flaming torch refer to knowledge. The white thunderbolt is a symbol of strength. (Approved, 13 Nov 1963.
