The RF-4C became Shaw's newest weapons system in 1965. Lt. Col. Arthur L. Osborne, commander of the 4415th Combat Crew Training Squadron, was the pilot of the first RF-4C to land here. The 4415th was also the first outfit to fly the Phantom II at Shaw. The 16th Tactical Reconnaissance Squadron was the first Air Force unit to become combat ready in the RF-4C on June 27, 1965.

The first delivery of the Air Force's tactical jet reconnaissance aircraft, the RF-4C, was made to TAC's 4415th Combat Crew Training Squadron at Shaw AFB, South Carolina. The ceremonies marked the first delivery of the RF-4C to the AF inventory., 28 Sep 1964
