On a rectangle divided per fess nebuly blue and white issuing from base in pale a gold demi-griffin shaded light brown and detailed brown surmounted in base by a red embattled wall throughout, the entire within a narrow gold border. **SIGNIFICANCE**: The emblem is symbolic of the squadron and its mission.
